I got a Facebook message from one of the pastor's daughters the next day and she told me that one of the girls I prayed with for healing, was healed and could walk because she couldn't before. Also, she told me that because of the little girl's healing, her mom accepted Christ herself because of what God did in her daughter. I've learned that God is still doing great things there, miracles and more, even when mission teams aren't there. We were blessed to have the opportunity to be His vessels. With faith and prayer, even when we were all the way back in the United States, God was still continuing His work in the villages we visited.

God revealed to me on this particular trip, that I've got a lot of potential in mission work and one day I would love to be more involved in missions in the Dominican Republic through MetroWest Caribbean Mission. It is an exciting thing but scary and challenging too; that's where faith and trust in God kicks in. I know He's got it all taken care of. I just have to do my part and act in faith !!
